Hello & Happy July! There is no place like Kodiak, especially during this time of year. The greenery of our emerald island truly is beautiful. I hope everyone is getting out and enjoying summer, on the sunny and not so sunny days we've been having.

July 1st begins our new fiscal year. This means grant reports are due, and we are awaiting notice of our FY27 grant applications. This year, the National Family Caregiver Support Program (NFCSP) and Senior In-Home (SIH) grants were competitive. The other two Department of Health State of Alaska grants – Island Cove Adult Day Program and Nutrition, Transportation & Support Services (NTS) – are continuation grants. The State of Alaska grants help support SCOK programs by about 1/3 of the cost. We are also awaiting award amounts for nonprofit grant applications we submitted to the City of Kodiak and Kodiak Island Borough. Once we have received all the grant funding information, we will put together our FY27 full agency budget.

Remember that you, too, can help support the Senior Center and our many services. Medicare Minute



In 2018, Medicare updated the Medicare card from containing a person's Social Security number to a random identifier that includes numbers and letters. That was the last time the card was updated and there is no plan to update it again.

What Does the Card Look Like?

The card from Medicare is a paper card that has a blue banner on the top, a white middle, and a red banner on the bottom. However, you can print your own in black and white.

Examples of Medicare Card Scams

- Someone calls you claiming:
 - You are getting a new, plastic Medicare card.
 - Medicare is switching to a card with chip in it.
 - It's a new year so you need a new card
 - You need a black and white card.
 - They need your Medicare number to see if you have received your new one yet.
 - They need you to verify your Medicare number so they can confirm you have the correct Medicare card.



What Can You Do To Stop New Medicare Card Scams?

- Do not answer calls from numbers you do not recognize.
- Do not confirm your Medicare number or answer "Yes" to any question.
- Guard your Medicare card and number like a credit card! Don't share your number, laminate it, make copies, or let anyone else make a copy.

How Can Your Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) Help?

Your local SMP is ready to provide you with the information you need to **PROTECT** yourself from Medicare fraud, errors, and abuse; **DETECT** potential fraud, errors, and abuse; and **REPORT** your concerns. SMPs and their trained teams help educate and empower Medicare beneficiaries in the fight against health care fraud. Your SMP can help you with your questions, concerns, or complaints about potential fraud and abuse issues. It also can provide information and educational presentations.

Health Wire

July is a prime time for seniors to enjoy the summer, balancing social, physical, and mental activities. Focus on safe, low-impact pursuits like morning gardening, gentle water aerobics, and scenic outdoor concerts. This summer, step out of your comfort zone and try something new!

Outdoor & Physical Activities

- **Gentle Strolls:** Take early morning or late afternoon walks at flat, scenic spots to avoid peak UV hours.
- **Water Aerobics:** Swimming is a fantastic low-impact exercise that protects joints while keeping the body cool. Check schedules at your local community center or pool.
- **Gardening:** Use raised planter beds for stress relief and light, satisfying exercise. **Social & Community Events**
- **Independence Day:** Celebrate safely with backyard picnics, American history trivia contests, or by attending daytime parades rather than late-night fireworks.
- **Outdoor Concerts:** Many towns host musical events in public parks. Bring a folding chair and enjoy!
- **Senior Centers:** Check the Event Calendar in this newsletter for community bingo, arts/crafts, or senior luncheons.
- **Visit the Library:** Escape the weather at the Kodiak Public Library to join book clubs, use computers, or pick up large-print novels.
- **Arts & Crafts in the Shade:** Host a crafting afternoon—like watercolor painting or scrapbooking—under a shady patio umbrella.
- **Board Games & Puzzles:** Gather friends or family for jigsaw puzzles, chess, or card games, which are excellent for cognitive health.
- **Stay Hydrated:** Drink plenty of fluids throughout the day, as seniors often lose their sense of thirst.
- **Sun Protection:** Wear wide-brimmed hats and high-SPF sunscreen when venturing outside.
- **Medication Check:** Review your prescriptions with a doctor or pharmacist, as some medications can increase sun sensitivity.

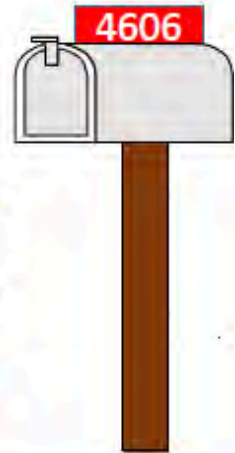
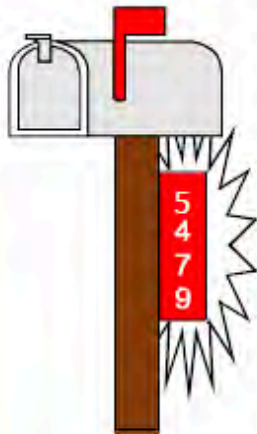
